RED NOSE DAY PROMPTS RED FOOTBALLS

WEEKEND REVIEW

All 33 matches were played on Saturday, the first time that has happened in quite a while.

Premier Division leaders Dover Athletic continued their serene path to the title with a 4–1 win at Harlow Town (sending the losers back into the bottom four), while nearest challengers Staines Town - 0–0 at Maidstone United – and Tonbridge Angels – 3–1 home losers against now fifth-placed Sutton United – dropped points. Six more points will guarantee the Whites at least a place in the playoffs. Carshalton Athletic came from behind to defeat Wealdstone 3–2 to stay in fourth spot. The battle at the bottom went Hendon's way, their 2–0 defeat of Heybridge Swifts reopening the five-point gap between the bottom two. Reading up, the next three teams all lost: Ramsgate went down 2–0 at Canvey Island and Harrow Borough went down 2–1 at home to AFC Hornchurch. Margate moved out of the bottom five with a 3–1 home win over Boreham Wood, while solitary-goal victories were enough for Ashford Town (Middlesex) at home to Dartford, Horsham, at Billericay, and Tooting & Mitcham United at home to Hastings United.

In Division One North, Aveley remain four points clear at the top after winning 1–0 at Ilford. East Thurrock United, 4–2 winners at Potters Bar Town, and Brentwood Town, who won 2–1 at Great Wakering Rovers, kept up the pressure, while Northwood's good form continued with a 2–0 home win against Maldon Town. Waltham Abbey stay in the top five despite being held to a 2–2 draw at Thamesmead Town. Hillingdon Borough remain bottom after losing 3–2 at Ware, while Witham Town went down 2–0 at Chatham Town to stay in the bottom two, but Waltham Forest moved four points clear of the drop zone with their 1–0 victory at Enfield Town. On the edge of the playoffs, Concord Rangers recorded a 2–0 victory at Wingate & Finchley and Tilbury went down 1–0 at home to Redbridge. Leyton and Cheshunt drew 1–1 at Lea Bridge Road.

Worthing, who took over top spot in midweek, slumped to fourth after their 21-game unbeaten run ended 1–0 at home to Sittingbourne. Kingstonian's 6–0 defeat of hapless Crowborough Athletic meant they finished the day top and bottom, respectively. Cray Wanderers won the top-of-the-table contest against Ashford Town at The Homelands, winning 2–0, while Fleet Town lost ground with a 1–0 home defeat at the hands of Walton & Hersham. Metropolitan Police remain third after a 3–0 victory at Whitstable Town. Corinthian-Casuals remain in the bottom two after they lost 2–0 at Eastbourne Town, but Chipstead increased their advantage over the Casuals to two points after they drew 2–2 at home to Dulwich Hamlet. Burgess Hill Town and Walton Casuals also picked up points, both from goalless home draws, against Croydon Athletic and Whyteleafe, respectively. The other two matches ended in 2–1 away victories, Leatherhead overcoming Folkestone Invicta and Merstham seeing off Godalming Town.

Premier Division

For once, the most important game of the day was at the bottom of the table where basement-dwellers Heybridge Swifts could have moved above Hendon with a victory at Scraley Road. It was not to be, as a pair of Brian Haule goals, after 81 and 90 minutes, ensured the Greens reopened a five-point gap between the bottom two clubs and they moved to within three points of safety. This is because Ramsgate conceded two goals in two minutes just before half-time at Canvey Island, Leon Gordon and Craig Davidson scoring, to lose 2–0, and Harlow Town lost 4–1 at home to leaders Dover Athletic. Lee Browning scored twice for the Whites in the first half, after 14 and 32 minutes, while Frannie Collin added a second half brace, after 61 and 82 minutes. In between, Ricci Crace had pulled a goal back for the Hawks.

Harrow Borough remain in trouble after conceding two goals in the opening 13 minutes on their way to a 2–1 home defeat at the hands of AFC Hornchurch. Michael Spencer opened the scoring after four minutes and Ross Wall got number two nine minutes later. Dwayne Clarke pulled a goal back ten minutes before the interval. Margate moved out of the bottom four after Dan Young, 47 minutes, Ryan Peters, 62, and Joe Healy, 71, scored against Boreham Wood at Hartsdown Park. Sean Sonner briefly gave Wood hope when he made it 2–1 after 69 minutes, but

Healy's goal sealed the game. Hastings United remain on the edge of the danger zone after Paul Vines' 86th-minute goal gave Tooting & Mitcham United all three points at Imperial Fields.

Staines Town lost ground on leaders Dover, drawing 0–0 at Maidstone United, while third-placed Tonbridge Angels were upset by fifth-placed Sutton United, losing 3–1. Leon Legge of the Angels opened the scoring at the wrong end just before half-time, and pulled a goal back for Tonbridge in the last minute but, in between, Gavin McCullum, 79 minutes, and Craig Dundas, had stretched the Us' advantage. Carshalton Athletic remain in the playoff places after first leading, then coming from behind to defeat Wealdstone 3–2. Richard Jolly opened the scoring after eight minutes, but two goals in two minutes, from a Ryan Ashe penalty and Lewis Gonsalves own goal, saw the Stones lead after 23 minutes. David Graves equalised for the Robins midway through the second half and Dwain Clarke bagged the winner.

Byron Harrison got the only goal – after 51 minutes – at Short Lane, giving Ashford Town (Middlesex) the spoils against Harlow Town. And it was a similar story at New Lodge, where Darren Budd's goal after 28 minutes was enough for visitors Horsham to overcome hosts Billericay Town.

Division One North

Neil Richmond scored the only goal after 56 minutes as leaders Aveley won 1–0 at Ilford. Second placed East Thurrock United scored three times in the first half at Potters Bar Town on their way to a 4–2 victory. Kris Newby, nine minutes, Max Cornill, 11, and Martin Tuohy, 33, were the marksmen. Two minutes into the second half, the Scholars pulled a goal back through Sam Adejokun, but Cornhill restored the three-goal cushion 15 minutes later. Dan Odamo grabbed a consolation for Potters Bar with 12 minutes to go. Brentwood Town had to come from a goal down at Great Wakering Rovers – Lewis Sparrow scoring after 17 minutes – to win 2–1. Their marksman was Mitch Hann, who netted after 34 and 57 minutes.

Northwood remain six points behind the top three in fourth place after Solomon Henry scored twice in the last three minutes to give the Woods a 2–0 victory over Maldon Town at Chestnut Avenue. Waltham Abbey, however, slipped up, drawing 2–2 at Thamesmead Town. Dean Holness twice gave the hosts the

lead, after 20 and 50 minutes, but David Ayres equalised twice, after 45 and 77 minutes. Ware scraped a 3–2 win over bottom club Hillingdon Borough. Lewis Hilliard's 20th-minute opener was cancelled out by Stephen Midega eight minutes later, but Jack Bradshaw, 35 minutes, and Hilliard again, 43, gave Ware a two-goal half-time lead. Zachary Gill set up a tense finish with a goal after 74 minutes, but there were no more goals.

Two goals in a minute from Lee Barnett were enough for Chatham Town to defeat Witham Town 2–0 and leave the Essex club in the bottom two. Waltham Forest, however, did themselves a power of good by beat Enfield Town on Joel Palmer's 86th-minute goal.

A solitary goal, from Thomas Laxton after 49 minutes, was enough for Redbridge to win at Tilbury, while efforts from Elliot Buchanan, 57 minutes, and Kevin Watson, 67, gave Concord Rangers a 2–0 victory at Wingate & Finchley. In the other game, Leyton led Cheshunt with a Michael Bakare goal after 76 minutes, but Bradley Harrison equalised in the final minute.

Division One South

Kingstonian returned to the top of the table in fine style, inflicting more misery on bottom club Crowborough Athletic, with a 6–0 victory at Kingsmeadow. Phil Williams got the ball rolling after seven minutes, and he was followed by strikes from Carl Wilson-Dennis, 15 and 48, Bobby Traynor, 51, Julien Thompson, 60, and Craig Mullen, 80. Cray Wanderers are back up to second after their 2–0 win at Ashford Town. Leigh Bremner and Mark Willy scored in the opening 17 minutes and they held on the rest of the way. Metropolitan Police are third after Scott Forrester, 43 minutes, James Greenaway, 73, and an own goal from Clint Gooding gave them a 3–0 win at Whitstable Town.

Worthing's long unbeaten run came to an end at the AtoB Stadium when Sittingbourne's Tom Bradbrook scored the only goal after 64 minutes. Fleet Town also lost 1–0 at home, to Walton & Hersham, for whom Andy Whyld scored after 35 minutes. The other Walton team, Casuals picked up a point from a home goalless draw against Whyteleafe, and it was the same outcome at Leylands Park, where Burgess Hill Town and Croydon Athletic had a goalless stalemate.

Both Folkestone Invicta and Godalming Town scored first-half equalisers but still lost 2–1 at home. At the Buzzlines Stadium, Tom Hutchings scored both of Leatherhead's goals,

after 36 and 89 minutes, while the leveller came from Michael Everitt. Godalming's Andy Ottley cancelled out Matt Francis's fourth-minute opener for Merstham, while Kwebena Agyei netted the winner midway through the second half. At Chipstead, Laurent Hamici equalised twice for Dulwich Hamlet, after 45 and 65 minutes, to restore parity after Danny Oakins, 35 minutes, and Zak Graham, 63, had given the Chips an advantage. In the other game, at The Saffrons, Eastbourne Town's Peter Cooper scored after 14 minutes to set up a 2-0 victory over Corinthian-Casuals. Jamie Salvidge got the second goal ten minutes from time.

Ryman Youth League

For many a long time, probably going back to last November, there was a full programme of matches in the Ryman Youth League this week, with seven league matches and four Isthmian Youth Cup matches successfully completed.

In the North West Division of the Ryman Youth League, leaders Staines Town were held to a 1-1 draw on their visit on Monday evening to Woking, thus extending their lead at the top of the Division to 11 points, but having played four games more than second placed AFC Wimbledon – and these two clubs still have to meet this season.

Two evenings later, Walton & Hersham won by 2-1 on their visit to Corinthian-Casuals, whilst Tooting & Mitcham United recorded a victory by the same scoreline when entertaining their visitors Kingstonian.

There was no change at the top of the South East Division, as on Monday evening Croydon retained top spot with a 3-1 win at Burgess Hill Town, coming back from a one goal deficit at half time. On the same night, second placed Lewes also recorded an away win, beating hosts Tonbridge Angels 2-0 with two first half goals.

Whyteleafe and Worthing shared the points on Wednesday evening with a 1-1 draw, whilst the following night Maidstone United beat basement club Horsham YMCA 6-1 at home, Scott Byers scoring four of the goals for the Kent side.

In the third round of the Isthmian Youth Cup, Carshalton Athletic and AFC Wimbledon both

recorded 2-0 home wins to become the first two clubs to reach the quarter final stages of the competition, beating Hampton & Richmond Borough and Eastbourne Town respectively.

Two Second Round matches were also completed, with Wealdstone winning 3-1 at Northwood on Monday evening and Margate beating neighbours Ramsgate 6-0 on Wednesday, to both move into the Third Round

On Saturday's victory, Greaves said: "It was a good win for us. It was a big game to win because not only did it give us three points and some confidence but it also drags another team into the relegation battle. We've only got another six wins to get to reach my target and that's out of 17 games. I was impressed with the spirit of the team and we had a lift with Kevin's arrival. The fact that he played up front with David Barefield meant we had two experienced strikers up there to give the ball to."
